

# AOP Stream Barrier Surveys

TROUT UNLIMITED

- Determine Effect of Stream Barriers on Aquatic Organism Passage (AOP)
  - Quantitative Evaluation
  - Ranks Severity of Stream Barriers (Culverts, Bridges, Fords)
- Teams: 4 (8 Trained Team Leaders)
- Volunteers: 31 (24 Participants)
- Phase I Crossings with Trout
  - Completed April 2023
  - 113 Sites Surveyed
  - 16 Severe Barriers
- Phase II Crossings with Fish
  - Initiated November 2023
  - 124 of 165 Sites Surveyed (75%)









# AOP Stream Barrier Surveys - Results



- Over 1,200 Volunteer Hours
  - \$36,000 of Labor Cost Savings to GSMNP
  - 237 Sites Surveyed
- High Priority Project with TU Southern Appalachian Region
  - Recognized by Trout Unlimited CEO Chris Wood in Keynote Address at TU Southeast Regional Rendezvous
  - Supports TU Priority Waters Initiatives in GSMNP
- Culverts at Two (2) Crossings in Cosby Area Proposed for Replacement
- Provides GSMNP Fisheries Department Data Needed to Influence Stream Crossing Improvements
- Assisting/Advising TU Chapters in Virginia & Georgia








# Trout In The Classroom Spring Releases
